2011 ESSAY TOPIC:

“IN HIS FAREWELL ADDRESS IN PHILADELPHIA IN 1796, GEORGE WASHINGTON WARNED AGAINST THE ADVENT OF POLITICAL PARTIES IN NATIONS WITH POPULACE-ELECTED GOVERNMENTS. DO YOU BELIEVE OUR NATION’S HISTORY SUPPORTS HIS VIEWS? EXPLAIN.”

- Contest open to: Students in the 10th, 11th and 12th grades who are not previous winners.
- Essay format: Length: Essay must not exceed 750 words (excluding cover sheet, title and sources) or it will be disqualified. Essay must be typed, double-spaced, in 12 pt. Times or similar font, with student’s name and home address on each page. Essay must have a cover sheet with essay topic, student’s name, home address, telephone number, e-mail address and cell phone number (if applicable.) Essay topic must not be in any way altered.
- Application form: Essay must be accompanied by a completed Colonial Dames/Washington Workshops application form, signed by student and parent or guardian, complete with photo (school picture, snapshot or photocopy is acceptable.) **Note: no** application fee is required by entrants as this is paid by the sponsoring organization.
- How to enter: **One** completed application form (with photo) and three copies of the essay are to be sent to the Colonial Dame listed on the application form (or the poster) by January 15, 2011. If that information is missing, please contact info@dumbartonhouse.org. and state student’s city and state of residence in order to obtain address for mailing. Essays are judged at the State, Regional and National level. Winners will be notified by mail in early April, 2011 by the National Consultant. Decision of the judges is final.
- Prize: A week in Washington, D.C. - **JUNE 18 - 24 2011!**
Attendance at a Congressional Seminar Workshop planned and coordinated by The Washington Workshops Foundation. The seminar is a unique experience in the study of American national government with emphasis on the concerns and activities of the United States Congress.
- Value: Approximately \$1,500 which pays for the following expenses: Application fee, tuition, seminar materials, local transportation (for seminar activities) plus college dorm room (double occupancy), bedding, linens and two meals daily (breakfast and dinner) at a university campus in the D. C. area. Funds toward travel/miscellaneous expenses are provided by some State Societies.
